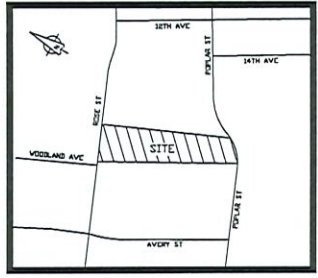

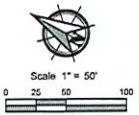
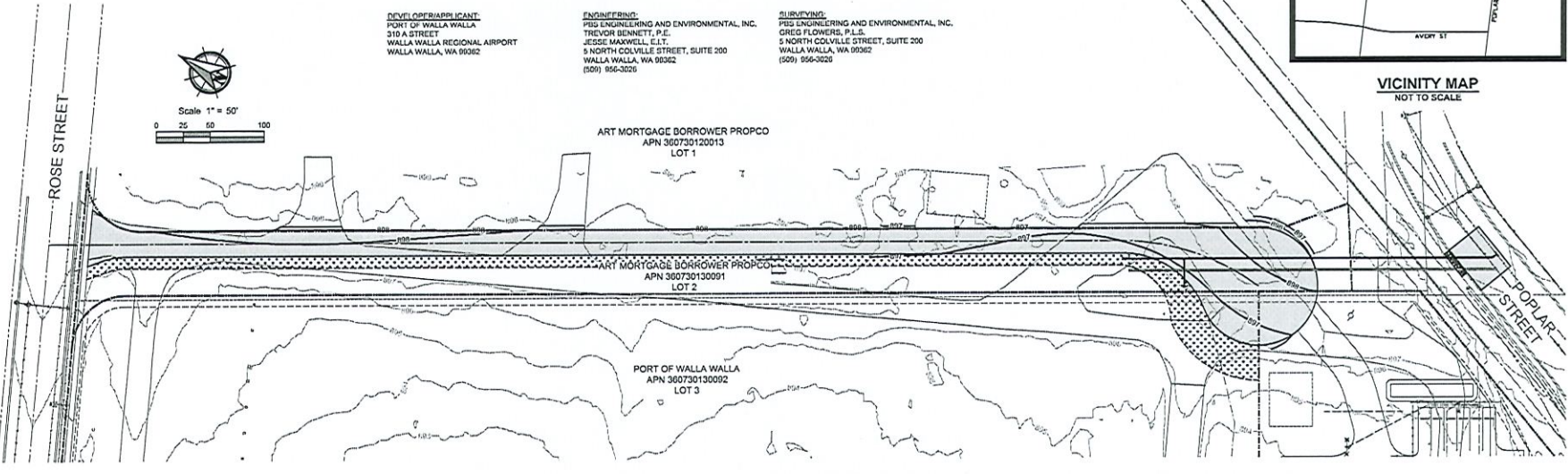


VICINITY MAP NOT TO SCALE
